– “I AM A CONSTITUTIONAL CITIZEN!” –

TUNISIA E-FORUM VIDEO CONTEST

Right to Nonviolence is organizing as part of its Tunisian e-Forum the ‘I am a Constitutional Citizen’ video contest.

You can be part of our e-Forum by submitting a video describing your views on the constitutional transitions taking place in the Middle East as a reply to [our explanatory YouTube video](#).

Prizes include a **paid internship with Right to Nonviolence**, the opportunity to attend a **high-profile regional conference “Integrating Islamic law and/or the Middle East Religious Tradition in a 21st Century Constitution”** in January 2013.

What do you have to do?

Step One

Go to our YouTube page and submit [in reply to our video](#), your video, describing your views on one of the constitutional transition processes taking place in the Middle East. (comment section below - click on "Respond to this video" and then "Create a video response"). Be creative using your webcam or any other recording device!

Step Two

Please ensure that videos are no longer than 10 minutes in length. It is advisable to be as concise as possible in your presentations. Videos in English, Arabic and French are accepted.

Step Three

Once you have submitted your video, send an email to videos@righttononviolence.org with your name and the title of your video contribution.

That’s all!

What next?

The top 10 videos will be aired on the [Right to Nonviolence YouTube channel](#).

Only the top 10 entries will be contacted and asked to provide a CV, a one-page letter of motivation/interest for working for Right to Nonviolence as an intern, and proof of nationality.

A panel of independent judges will then select 3 winners from the top 10 videos; these will be published on our Tunisia Constitutional e-Forum and will be eligible for one of 3 exclusive prizes (details below).

DEADLINE

Entries must be uploaded by **5pm GMT +2, October 2, 2012.**



Entry Requirements

- The contest is open to all individuals aged 18 and over and to Middle East nationals only (Afghanistan, Algeria, Bahrain, Djibouti, Egypt, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Mauritania, Morocco, Oman, Pakistan, West Bank and Gaza Strip, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Somalia, South Sudan, Sudan, Syria, Tunisia, Turkey, UAE, and Yemen).
- To qualify for the prizes, the contributor must be proficient in English
- Entries must be your own original work. Please see YouTube's copyright rules (http://www.youtube.com/t/howto_copyright/)
- Please submit only one video per person.
- Assessing visa and travel restrictions will be the individual's responsibility

PRIZES

Prizes will be offered to the presenters of the 3 top videos selected from the 10 shortlisted entries:

- The **first prize** is a two-month internship with Right to Nonviolence during 2013. The winner will receive \$2,500 that will go towards flights and expenses in Beirut.
- The **second prize** is an invitation to join the Right to Nonviolence regional seminar* in January on "Integrating Islamic law and/or the Middle East Religious Tradition in a 21st Century Constitution". Flights and accommodation will be covered up to the value of \$1,500.
- The **third prize** is a copy of Professor Mallat's "[Introduction to Middle Eastern Law](#)" and \$400.

JUDGING

A panel of 3 professionals will judge the top 3 videos. Details of judges will be released soon.

Assessment will take into account not only the video, but also the individual's academic or personal achievements and the relevance of the individual's interests to Right to Nonviolence's work. Proficiency in English is a requirement.

Assessment of the video will be made on the basis of:

- Content
- Passion
- Originality
- Intellectual inquiry
